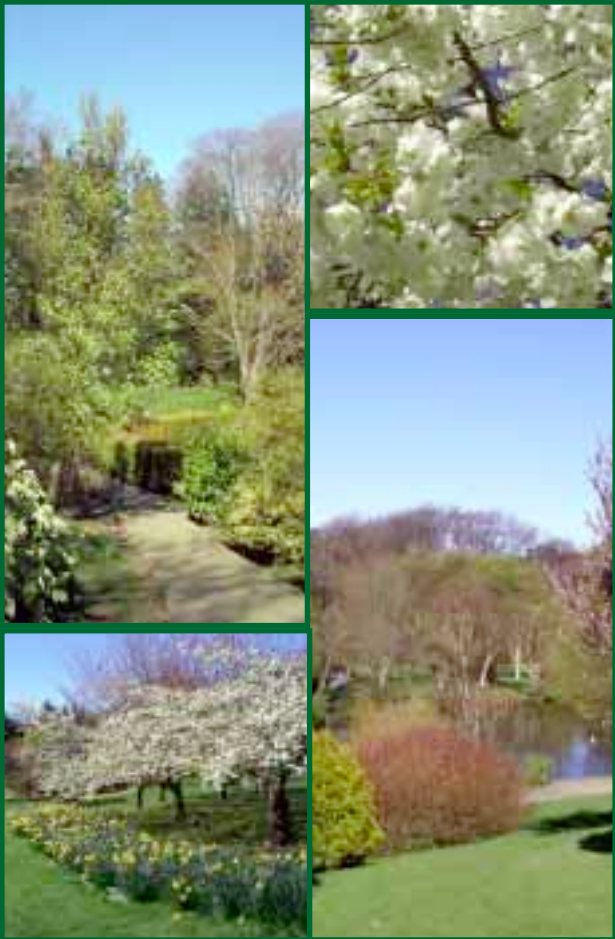

Seasons The park is attractive all year round and offers a variety of colour and foliage during different seasons. During winter, conifer species are very prominent. Blossom at this time of year is provided by trees and shrubs such as Viburnums, whilst twig colour is provided by Dogwood and Willow. In the spring, a variety of fresh new growth is visible, with early varieties of Japanese Cherry, and Berberis prominent alongside daffodils and crocus. The park is in full leaf and colour come the summer, exhibiting a range of shades of green, blue, grey and gold throughout. The main flower display ends around August/September with the fragrant white flowers of *Eucryphia nymmanensis* Nymansay. During the autumn, the park has a lot to offer as there is a great deal of colour, with Amelanchier and various maples at their best.



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The Phases The park covers an area of some 25 acres and is divided into three phases. The first and most formal, in the vicinity of the pond and lower slopes, consists of a wide range of ornamental trees and shrubs, including many unusual species such as *Acer nikoense* (Nikko Maple) and *Davidia involucrata* (Dove Tree). The area is divided by grassed rides. To the north and east, as the ground rises, planting becomes harder, with more native species such as holly, rowan, birch and oak. The third phase consists of open meadow plus private plantings donated by various organisations. Three roundels planted here were originally as an experiment to ascertain the relative merits of different species of alder as nursing trees, although the principal long-term species are beech, sessile oak and Scots pine.

THIS GUIDE

This leaflet has been designed to serve as a comprehensive guide to the various plant species located within Tynwald National Park and Arboretum, St.John’s. A map of the park is included for navigation purposes, showing the position of each of the numbered beds. The plants are listed both alphabetically and by bed location. All of the individual species have been allocated an index number, shown within the plant listings. Over time, the Forestry and Amenity office intend to number the individual trees with these index numbers, thus making identification even easier for the visitor.

THE ARBORETUM & ST.JOHNS

Tynwald National Park and the Arboretum is owned and maintained by the Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry (DAFF) and is situated close to the village of St.John’s. It was opened in 1979 to celebrate the Millenium of the Tynwald and contains over 200 different species of both native and exotic plant species. The annual cycle of new growth and blossom; full bloom; autumn fruit and foliage; and winter shape and colour makes this an interesting and attractive site all year round. The arboretum has been designed to serve as a tonic for mind and body so that one might always come away refreshed.

In addition to the village and the park itself, there are other attractions in the surrounding area. Close to the park is Cooill y Ree (Nook of the Kings). Maintained by DAFF, this is a formal landscape with a theme centered on a time-line that runs from Tynwald Hill out towards the west. A viewing point overlooks this area and is situated behind Tynwald Hill.

To the south is Garey ny Cloie, the grounds of DAFF’s Forestry, Amenity and Lands Division headquarters. These gardens were planted in the 1960s and consist of attractive tree and shrub plantings and amenity woodland of beech and Scarlet oak. The site extends upwards towards Slieau Whallian Plantation.
